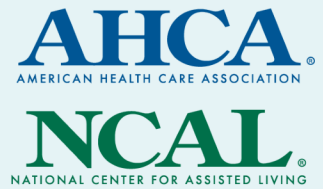


Why Should You Participate in NDWS?
